Questions About NRCs

Do NRC services cost anything?

- Most services are free of charge.

Will information be kept private?

- In general, Yes. However, there are some situations (e.g. child in danger) that NRCs are legally required to report.

Do I need to reside close to the NRC to obtain assistance?

- No, NRCs are open to all.

How long can I receive services?

- There is no specific length of time. It will depend on your family needs.

Can I receive services if I went to a NRC in the past?

- Yes you can.

How NRCs Can Help You

Below are some services NRCs provide. Please note that these services may vary by location.

- Help with parenting
- Connect you with other people in similar situations that can give you support and advice
- Connect you with resources or to other agencies that can help you during difficult times
- Provide someone to talk to privately (counselor)
- Provide health and nutrition information
- Help your family if there are serious issues such as fighting, drugs in the home, or other problems
- Translation of forms or documents
- Help filling out an application
- Assistance with food or clothing
- Help with gas/electric bills
- Medi-Cal and CalFresh (Food Stamps) applications/renewals
